

MAY SAFETY TALK

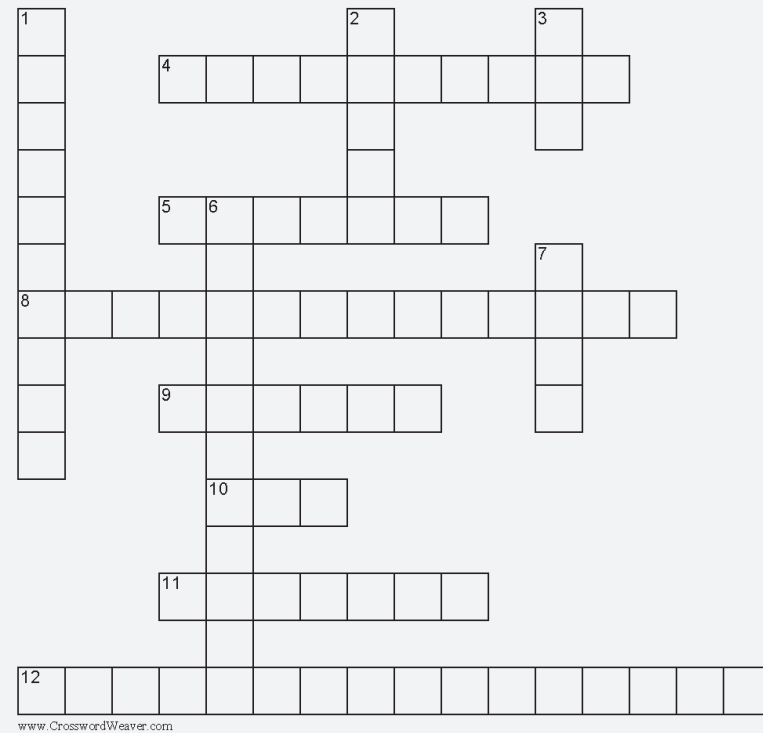

ACROSS

- 4 Analyzed by committee to develop recommendations for improvement in Safety Program
- 5 These must be posted for three months after the meeting takes place
- 8 conducted after a near miss or injury
- 9 Workers have right and obligation to do this if they believe there is an undue hazard to themselves or others
- 10 minimum number of Committees in Municipality with fire department
- 11 meetings should take place at this frequency
- 12 Identifies roles and responsibilities of committee

DOWN

- 1 First person the worker speaks to when refusing to do unsafe work
- 2 The number of hours of training per year that all committee members must be offered
- 3 JOHSC Structure is mandated by this (initials)
- 6 JOHSC must ensure these are conducted at a frequency to prevent hazards from developing
- 7 minimum number of members on JOHSC
